Parent Contract

- 1. Stay out of the dugout. Once the players go into the dugout, they belong to the coaches until the game is over and the coach has dismissed them. In the case of an emergency situation, the coach will come and get you if needed.
- 2. No talking to the players whatsoever. Let the coaches do their jobs without any interference from you. Limit your comments to encouraging your kid and the team in general.
- 3. Leave the umpires and the other team's parents alone. It is the coach's job to talk to the umpires and handle all game situations. Do not embarrass yourself and our organization by making immature comments. Set the proper example for others to follow.
- 4. No negative talking about any of the kids on your team, the opposing team, umpires or coaches. This is cancerous to the team and our organization. It will not be tolerated.
- 5. If you have a question or a problem, wait until the game is over and the team has been dismissed by the coach before approaching the coach. Coaches are volunteers and are doing the best job they can for all of our players.
- 6. HOW PARENTS BEHAVE AND ARE ALLOWED TO BEHAVE IS A DIRECT REFLECTION ON YOUR TEAM AND OUR ORGANIZATION. LET'S MAKE THIS SOMETHING THAT WE WILL BE PROUD TO BE A PART OF. YOUR BEHAVIOR AS A PARENT WILL HAVE A DIRECT IMPACT ON THE RECRUITING PROCESS OF YOUR DAUGHTER. SHE HAS WORKED HARD TO GET WHERE SHE IS AT. DO NOT RUIN IT FOR HER!
- 7. Any violation of these simple rules will result in disciplinary action up to and including extra physical training for your daughter, monetary fines, temporary suspension from the team, and even permanent dismissal from the team and our organization.
